# **Initiatives Update**





# **The Women's and Girls' Fund**

Ten years since its creation, over 600 donors have collectively given to build an endowment of \$1.2 million that will permanently support women and girls in Kern County. With the announcement of the 2015 awards, the Fund's cumulative grant total reached \$207,000.

# **Upper Kern Fisheries Enhancement Fund**

Established to support fisheries conservation projects in the Upper Kern River Basin, the Fund has granted over \$700,000 since 2007. Most recently, an \$80,000 grant was awarded to the Kern River Hatchery for improvements.



# **Kern River Valley Community Fund**

Striving to keep philanthropic capital local, the Fund is building to become a permanent charitable resource. Currently, a generous anonymous resident has offered to match every dollar raised, up to \$100,000. The Fund balance is at \$140,000; leaving \$40,000 of match funding still available.

# ation Strategic Priorities

# **College Access**

Each year, about 10,000 students graduate from public high schools in Kern County. All have the potential to enter into some form of higher education.

# **THE PROBLEM**

- The cost of Higher Education prohibits many talented students from attending.
- The complex application process for public and private financial aid makes tapping into financial resources difficult.
- Only 15% of Kern County adults (25 years+) have at least a Bachelor's degree.
- Only 33% of Kern County high school graduates complete UC/CSU "A-G" requirements.

# EVERY FORM OF HIGHER EDUCATION HAS A COST



1 IN 4 KERN COUNTY YOUNG ADULTS AGED 16-24 FALL INTO THE "DISCONNECTED YOUTH" CATEGORY; THEY ARE NEITHER WORKING NOR IN SCHOOL.

# **THE SOLUTION**

The complex problem of providing higher education access to our students requires a multifaceted solution that addresses both educational and financial hurdles.

# Centralized and Impactful Scholarships

- Grow funds through local donors to provide long term scholarship funding.
- Distribute local scholarships in a coordinated effort to maximize efficiency.

# College Access Blueprint

 Increase college attainment for Kern County students by convening educational stakeholders to create a College Access Blueprint.

In 2015, Kern Community Foundation piloted an online common scholarship application and awarded 115 to Kern County graduates, totaling \$236,000.






