GRANTS INFORMATION ACT OF 2018

- A single website for grantseekers to find State of California grant opportunities by July 1, 2020.
- All state grant and loan opportunities offered on a competitive or first-come basis
 - "Grant" as used in the legislation means any mechanism used by a state agency to distribute appropriations that have been allocated for the purpose of financial assistance through a competitive or first-come award process.
 - The term shall include **loans and federal assistance funds** that are administered by a state agency.
 - The term shall not include the procurement of goods or services for a state agency nor the acquisition, construction, alteration, improvement, or repair of real property for a state agency. [8334(c)]

Creating the California Grants Portal

- User-centered design approach
 - Initial grantseekers needs survey- 900 responses
 - One-on-one meetings- 40 grantmakers
 - Virtual co-design sessions- 119 grantseekers
 - Cross-departmental meetings- 100+ grantmakers
 - Wireframe feedback webinar 40+ grantseekers and 80+ grantmakers
 - Wireframe survey -~32 responses
 - Beta feedback- ~268 responses
- Open data and Open sourcing the code
