GBK's annual day of giving is made possible by the generous support from donors, sponsors, and community members.

GIVE Big KERN



- \$3.3 million has been raised since the launch of Give Big Kern for local nonprofits
- \$885,235 total amount raised this year
- . 6% increase compared to amount raised in 2021

- 132 participating nonprofits
 - **\$6,706** average amount of dollars raised per organization
 - 100% of participating nonprofit organizations received a donation
 - . 2,398 donors
 - .703 new donors
 - 110 organizations received at least one new donor


- Marley's Mutts Dog Rescue received **395** donors winning the prize of Most Individual Donors.



WATCH PARTY




