


MEET THE STAFF!

This year, Kern Futures awarded 62 new students with college scholarships totaling \$97,100. About 64 continuing students received \$112,000 in renewable scholarships. Totaling \$209,100 in scholarships for 2022!

Recently, the Summer Bridge Program came to an end for 2022 participants. The Summer Bridge Program consists of weekly meetings with scholarship recipients to strengthen their skills and better prepare them for their first year of college. They are assigned to Kern Futures Peer Mentors, who were previous KCF scholarship recipients, to provide them with advice and guidance for the upcoming college year.

Upper Kern Fisheries

The Fall cycle of the Upper Kern Fisheries grant is now open. The Upper Kern Fisheries Enhancement Fund was established as part of an agreement for fisheries mitigation during the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC) re-licensing of the Kern River Number 3 Hydroelectric Plant (KR3), which is located on the Upper Kern River near Kernville. It was established with an initial contribution of \$2.5 million by Southern California Edison (SCE), and has grown to nearly \$3.5 million while distributing close to \$1.7 million in grants benefiting the Upper Kern River Basin.
