The annual luncheon for the Women's and Girls' Fund celebrated their 17 years on September 22, 2022. Established in 2003 by Judi McCarthy, along with other like-minded women in the community, found the importance of transforming the lives of women and girls in Kern County. The Women's and Girls' Fund is a Kern Community Foundation leadership initiative. The WGF is primarily a volunteer effort supported by KCF and guided by the leadership of the Vision Committee and Community Advisors. Its mission is t o Empower, Educate, and **Endow** by transforming the lives of women and girls in Kern County by mobilizing the power and passion of women working together.

Michelle Vitale, Vision Committee Chair, said, "The celebration of philanthropy and community honor the time and treasure of individuals, families, groups of friends and neighbors, coming together to create better tomorrows for us all." During the luncheon, WGF grantees, Kern County Educational Services Foundation (KCSOS), No Sister Left Behind, and STARBASE Edwards provided an update on the projects they have been working on.

A huge congratulations to the 2022 Judi McCarthy Philanthropy Awardees Michele "Mikie" Hay and Rhea Sharma. Mikie is a lifelong philanthropist and is passionate about community service and education. Currently, Mikie is the director of the Ford Dimension and the Dream Builder Student Leadership program, which she started. Rhea Sharma, a senior at Stockdale, co-founded a UNICEF Club on campus and has raised \$15,000 for the Uganda Project to support the construction of an orphanage and a kindergarten.
