

#### Oscar and Libbie Rudnick Scholarship Fund



The Oscar and Libbie Rudnick Scholarship Fund started in 2012 to provide educational opportunities for students in Kern County. The endowed scholarship was established with a \$500,000 gift in memory of Elynor Rudnick Falk by her husband Dr. David Falk. In August 2022, after Dr. Falk's passing, Kern Community Foundation received another \$5,000,000 gift for the Fund to be used for scholarships. This historic gift will transform the lives of deserving Kern County students in perpetuity.

This gift is the single largest donation ever made through Kern Community Foundation. "This gift is an eternal mitzvah," said Aaron Falk, President & CEO of Kern Community Foundation. "The Oscar and Libbie Rudnick Scholarship Fund has established an everlasting bond between the Rudnick's and the future of Kern County." Since 2012, the Fund has granted \$161,300 in scholarships to Kern County students. This amount should dramatically increase over the next few years.

The Community Wildfire Defense Grant Program is to assist at-risk local communities and Indian Tribes with planning and mitigating against the risk created by wildfire.

The grants are only for eligible projects developed by communities, Tribes, states, non-profits, and Alaska Native Corporations. Communities will receive priority for this program if they are a low-income area, recently impacted by disaster or in a wildfire hazard location.

The Dolores Huerta Foundation is a 501(c)(3) organization on a mission to inspire and organize communities to build volunteer organizations empowered to pursue social justice. DHF organizes at the grassroots level developing natural leaders with hands-on training through collective action working to establish Vecinos Unidos (Neighbors United) chapters in some of the most disenfranchised regions of California.

DHF raised \$236,348 winning the prize of Most Dollars Raised for Give Big Kern 2022! In 2019, DHF embarked on a mission to establish the Dolores Huerta Peace
